Saints Philip and James named Blue Ribbon School

Congratulations to Saints Philip and James School (SSPJ) for being named a National Blue Ribbon School in 2023. The National Blue Ribbon Schools (NBRS) Program is one of the U.S. Department of Education's longest-running recognition programs. NBRS recognizes outstanding public and non-public elementary, middle, and high schools based on their overall high academic achievement or success in closing the achievement gap among diverse groups of students. Since its inception in 1982, the goals of the program are

to shine a spotlight on the best schools in the United States and to share best practices of outstanding schools across the country. SSPJ first received the Blue Ribbon Award in 1989 and again this school year 2023. In addition, the Office of Catholic Education has recognized SSPJ as a School of "Distinguished Instruction" in 2019, 2021, and 2022 based on their Terra Nova test scores. This acknowledgement has promoted high achievement among the students and challenges teachers to maintain high standards of instruction within their classrooms. The Preschool program has been voted the Best Preschool in Chester County by the readers of the Daily Local for three consecutive years. These awards have attracted new families to enroll their children.

The Blue Ribbon Schools designation was followed by another award, this time for *Principal Sister Teresa Ballisty, IHM*, who received the Terrel H. Bell Award. The U.S. Department of Education presents the Bell Award to the principals of National Blue Ribbon Schools for their outstanding work and the vital role they play in guiding their students and schools to excellence, frequently under challenging circumstances.

Sister Teresa Ballisty arrived at Saints Philip and James School in 2017, at a

time when the school needed supportive leadership to address a variety of challenges. Enrollment had declined, school facilities needed upgrades, and the school's sense of culture and community needed a boost. Sister Teresa initiated a Board of Limited Jurisdiction with the support of the pastor and the Office of Catholic Education. Taking a collaborative approach, Principal Ballisty quickly involved the newly formed Board with teachers, parents, and other partners in developing a Strategic Five-Year Plan to improve multiple aspects of the school, including facilities, finances, and academic support.

The outcomes of her leadership included retention growth from 70% to 90%, and over-

all enrollment increasing by 20% during her tenure as principal. Her leadership has been instrumental in reshaping SSPJ into an institution that excels academically, nurtures a positive community, and actively involves its members.

The Council has been well served by the guidance and educational experience and perspective of member **Dr. Laura Erhard Fiorenza**.

Dr. Fiorenza is an Associate Professor in the Early and Middle Grades Education Department at West Chester University. She has served on the Chester County Advisory Council for Catholic Elementary Education for six years. Her strong commitment to education, particularly Catholic Education, has been evident through her early years of teaching at Mother of Divine Providence School and her service through the Chester County Intermediate Unit as a guidance counselor for the former Coatesville Area Catholic Elementary School for 5th-8th grades.



Dr. Fiorenza is actively engaged in the field of education as she prepares

future educators to skillfully facilitate the academic growth and development of the next generation. Each semester she supervises students in the field as they hone their pre-service teaching skills. She is the chapter advisor for the international education honor society Kappa Delta Pi, and she coordinates an annual professional development conference each spring for pre-service and in-service educators.

Additionally, Dr. Fiorenza acts as the coordinator of the Post Baccalaureate Early and Middle Grades Teaching Certification Programs at the university. Her academic research interests include school and classroom climates, social-emotional learning, school bullying, and finding ways of engaging students to increase student motivation and academic commitment.

She is a published author who has presented her research regionally and nationally. Dr. Fiorenza believes in the potential of all students to be successful and in the importance of building relationships with students to ensure a caring, supportive, and nurturing environment.
